The *Leader* reported that it's been just about a hundred years since a law enforcement officer shot a suspect and, back then, it was a man who'd robbed a bank in Sequim. We live in a relatively peaceful place out here, but last Friday, there was gunfire in Brinnon and Jefferson County deputies shot and killed someone. At this time, we don't know who was shot, or what deputy or deputies were involved. The Sheriff's Department requested that the state patrol investigate the incident and so far they have not made their findings public. Deputy Bret Anglin explained that state law says when such an investigation is underway, even the district sheriff's office has no access to investigative information. So stay tuned.

Last Thursday, members of the Creative Alliance, a group of Port Townsend's most determined forward-thinking organizations signed 25-year leases with the Fort Worden Public Development Authority. These agreements essentially exchange free rent for on-going maintenance and improvement of the 14 structures that will house the 8 tenants: Centrum, Copper Canyon Press, Corvidae Press, Madrona Mind and Body, Northwind Art, Port Townsend School of Woodworking, Rainshadow Recording, AND KPTZ Radio! According to Teresa Verraes of Northwind, the long leases give everyone a chance to plan and upgrade their facilities and make Fort Worden a major center for arts and culture. Everyone involved agrees that getting to this place has been a long and complex journey. Congratulations to all involved.

Next Saturday, October 8, from 10-3pm, the Chamber of Port Townsend at 2409 Jefferson Street is holding an EV Expo that will showcase new technology in the field of battery-charged vehicles. There will be a variety of electric vehicles and lots of important and interesting information available. Partnering with the Chamber on this event is the City of Port Townsend, Local 20/20, Jefferson PUD, and Jefferson Transit. The Food Co-op reports on a local effort to up-cycle plastic right here in town. PT Potential has started operating out of a workshop near the airport. They are shredding plastic using a low-speed grinder with a vacuum attachment and they plan to make things such things as taco baskets, bathroom tiles, rulers, pegboard, and farm boxes. So, instead of putting plastics in the trash, you can save and clean your #1, 4 and 5 plastics and take them to the Marine Science Center at Fort Worden on the first Saturday of the month or the Food Co-op from 2-4 on the third Saturday of each month.

The Stubblefield Institute encourages positive civic engagement, and intelligent, authentic, constructive debate. Representative Derek Kilmer was recently recognized with an inaugural 2022 Stubblefield Civility Award for Civil Political Communications. The award is presented to elected leaders and members of the media for consistent displays of fairness and civility. Kilmer received the award, in part, for his leadership to make Congress more effective and efficient as Chair of the Committee on the Modernization of Congress – which has

passed over 170 bipartisan recommendations that aim to make Congress work better for the American people. Other award winners you might recognize are David Brooks and Mark Shields from the PBS Newshour.
